

# Netting Process in Vineyards

This document will show you the step by step process that Amigoni Vineyards has proven is successful for netting vineyards with our Bird Barricade by Dewitt.

## Step 1:

Hedge your vineyard just prior to installation of netting. This allows the minimum time for lateral growth of the vines. We use a gas powered hedge trimmer that is run in the vertical position on one side of the trellis and again run in the vertical position down the other side of the trellis. A third pass is run in the horizontal position 3 to 5 inches above the highest catch wires.

## Step 2:

A 1" PVC pipe that is about 8 feet long is put through the netting tube. The 14 foot wide netting is folded twice to 3.5 feet wide. With two workers on each side, the netting is rolled out over the top of trellis



### Step 3:

At the end of the row, move the roll over the top of the end post and giving you some extra netting to wrap around the pole, bunch up the netting and cut with a sharp knife.

### Step 4:

We use “S” hooks to secure the netting around the poles and around the trunks of the plants. We use a 2” S hook as shown. You can also use zipties. We sell them on this site.



## Step 5:

Grab both sides of the netting and rolling them together as shown :



## Step 6:

Take the S hook and secure one side of the hook:



## Step 7:

Next you flip the S hook over and secure the other side of the hook:



**Step 8:**

You now have one side secured and you need to do the other side of the trunk:



## Step 9:

Here is a picture of both sides of the trunk secured with S hooks.:



## Step 10:

You need to do the same process for the end posts and the other poles in the vineyard row:







## Step 11:

Drink a glass of wine from Amigoni Vineyards:
